Dr. Theodore "Ted" Winthrop Eller

Dr. Theodore Winthrop "Ted" Eller, age 93, passed away on Wednesday, August 23, 2017 at Homestead Memory Care Center in Knoxville.

Ted was born in Clarinda, Iowa on August 10, 1924; the son of Dr. Clyde and Myra (Graff) Eller. Ted graduated from Clarinda High School, where he met the love of his life, Caroline Lucille Saner. Following graduation, Ted and Caroline were married. They were blessed with seven children.

Ted began his service in the military during WWII. He completed his Doctor of Dental Surgery degree

at Creighton University in Omaha. Ted moved to Knoxville where he



set up his dental practice in 1951 and served his patients for the next

43 years before retiring in 1994.


